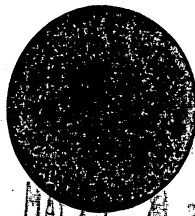

Dear Sir or Madam,

I am writing you on behalf of my friend and business associate Mr. William Dunham Jr. who received a \$15.00 parking violation in front of my house at 1 Walker Terrace (58-60 Walker St.) between 7 and 11 pm on May 11. Mr. Dunham was attending a business/social event at my residence along with two other friends. Since my 2 visitor parking permits were being used by my 2 other friends, I was unable to give one to Mr. Dunham who was ticketed with violation # CA5407533. (car registration 807-BTY.)

I respectfully ask you to rescind Mr. Dunham's fine in light of the above circumstances. While the resident parking laws are necessary in light of the parking situation in Cambridge, enforcement should concentrate on abuse of visitor permits and on daytime violations. It is dangerous to both the commercial and social health of our city if one cannot have a business or social gathering at one's residence for more than 2 guests with vehicles registered outside Cambridge, even on weekends or after business hours.
