

Cambridge, May 17, 1841-

At a meeting of ^{the Selectmen of Brighton with} a joint-Committee of the City Council
of Cambridge, appointed to confer with ^{said} ~~the~~ Selectmen of
~~Brighton~~ in relation to the repairs needed upon the
Great Bridge, ^{and said Selectmen} present Jacob F. Taylor, Granville
Fuller, and William R. Champney, the Selectmen
of Brighton, and Hon. James S. Green, Samuel Sloan-
comb, John S. Pollard, Ebenezer Fogg, and Nathaniel
S. Sawin, of said Committee, it was unanimously
voted, that, in the opinion of all the gentlemen
above named, it is expedient that said Bridge should
be at once repaired so as to be safe for the public
travel.

Also voted, that it is expedient that said repairs
should be made by the City of Cambridge, on behalf
of itself and said Town of Brighton.

And said Selectmen, by agreeing to the passage of
the votes aforesaid, are understood on behalf of said
Town of Brighton, to authorize the Surveyors of Highways
of said City of ~~said~~ Cambridge, (so far as they lawfully

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fully may authorize them) to make any of said repairs
upon the Brighton side of the dividing line between Cam-
bridge and Brighton, without being deemed to be guilty
of any manner of trespass.

Resolved. That, in the opinion of all the gentlemen above named, it is expedient that said Bridge should be at once repaired so as to be safe for the public travel.

Also Resolved. That it is expedient that said repairs should be made by the City of Cambridge, in behalf of itself and said Town of Brighton.

And said Selectmen, by agreeing to the passage of the votes aforesaid are understood, in behalf of said Town of Brighton, to authorize the Surveyors of Highways of said City of Cambridge. (so far as they have

fully may authorize them,) to make any of said repairs
upon the Brighton side of the dividing line between Cambridge
and Brighton, without being deemed to be guilty of any man-
ner of trespass.
