In answer to the City Council's request for additional police coverage in the Erie Street area, please be advised that this is being done.

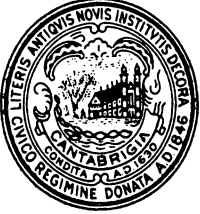
The process of distributing manpower for the entire city is one that is scrutinized and updated constantly. When the need arises, as in this case, the deployment of manpower is distributed in such a way that adequate coverage is assured.

The Erie Street area has a two-man Sector car, a one-man car, and the Sector Sergeant assigned from the uniform division. In addition, the plainclothes division has been advised of this problem and will give it extra attention. The use of foot patrol in this area is not as advantageous as motorized patrol.

In conclusion, be assured that Erie Street and the entire city will receive the proper coverage for any and all situations.

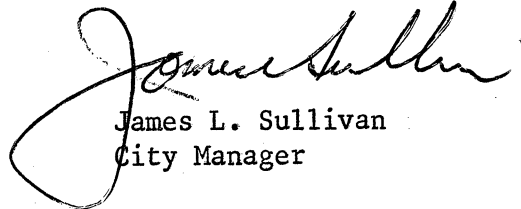
