WHEREAS: Mr. Kepes was a world renown authority on the convergence of art and technology, wrote extensively on the subject, and founded the Center for Advanced Visual Studies at M.I.T. in 1964; and

WHEREAS: Mr. Kepes is survived by his two children, Juliet Stone and Imre Kepes; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council hereby acknowledge Mr. Kepes's important life-work and his significant contributions to Cambridge; and be it further
