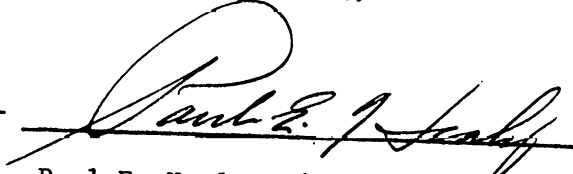
COUNCILLOR VELLUCCI

- ORDERED: That this City Council grant this request with the provision that there be no amplification of the music and speakers; and be it further
- ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to take the necessary actions to ensure that the intent and provisions stated in this order are carried out and to contact the appropriate departments concerned to grant any necessary permits in connection with said Mother's Day Peace Festival.

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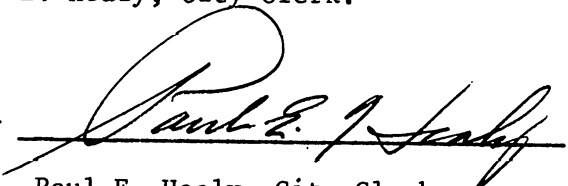
