WHEREAS: She channelled her energies to bring her beliefs into action especially by her work as a member of the NAACP from 1951 onward. From 1958 to 1975 she was an elected members of the NAACP's executive committee; and

WHEREAS: Her career involvement in the healing profession both at the Massachusetts General Hospital and the Massachusetts Eye and Ear Infirmary carried over into her life in the community where she brought the message and mission of healing into situations where stress and tension were present; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council express respect and thanks for the life of Roberta F. Beer and convey sympathy to her husband, Professor Samuel H. Beer, and the members of her family; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a duly engrossed copy of this Resolution and forward same to Professor Samuel H. Beer.
