Hilda Romanko

Denis Kennedy of Quincy, a retired carpenter, died Wednesday at Quincy Medical Center after a long illness. He was 86.

Born in County Sligo, Ireland, Mr. Kennedy moved to Boston in 1957, where he worked on several local building projects, including the Prudential Building and the Globe Building in Dorchester. Mr. Kennedy also renovated and built several houses in Dorchester and Boston.

After working as a contractor, he took a job as a carpenter for the Boston Housing Authority, where he worked for more than 20 years until he retired in 1981.

Mr. Kennedy was a prominent member in the Boston Irish community. He was active in local American organizations

and was a staunch advocate of the reunification of Ireland. Mr. Kennedy worked on several political campaigns.

He was a longtime member of the Boston chapter of Irish Northern Aid, which honored Mr. Kennedy and his wife at its annual banquet about five years ago. Mr. Kennedy was also a longtime member of the Ancient Order of Hibernians and a former member of the Committee for Justice in Northern Ireland.

He had been president of the carpenters union in Dublin.

He is survived by his wife, Mary (McGowan) of Quincy; three daughters, Anne Speidel of Forest, Va., Kathleen of Toulouse, France, and Mary Gabrielle of Randolph; three sons, Patrick of Braintree, Denis of Newburyport and Michael of South Boston; and seven grandchildren.
