WHEREAS: This day the City Council honors a much-loved departed son of Cambridge, William "Billy" Gerard Maher; and

WHEREAS: William was born in Cambridge on December 11, 1923; and

WHEREAS: William was a lifelong Cambridge resident; and

WHEREAS: William served his country in the United States Navy during World War II; and

WHEREAS: In October, 1949 at St. Peter's Church in Cambridge William Maher joined his hand, heart and life in Holy Matrimony with Lillian Cullen; and

WHEREAS: The marriage of William and Lillian was blessed with four fine children, Catherine, Mary, Andrew and David; as the children grew up and started families of their own, William and Lillian became the proud grandparents of Andrew, Betsy, Kendyl and Courtney; and

WHEREAS: William was appointed to the Cambridge Police Department as a Reserve Patrol Officer on October 17, 1954; and became a permanent Patrol Officer on March 25, 1961; and

WHEREAS: William left the Police Department briefly in 1960 to become a court officer in the Third District Court from September 26, 1960 to March 25, 1961; and

WHEREAS: William was elected to the Cambridge City Council in 1965 and served as a member of the City Council for the 1966-1967 term; and

WHEREAS: As an officer of the Cambridge Police Department, William received several commendations for his excellent work; and

WHEREAS: William was recognized by the Cambridge City Council for his outstanding security assistance when Vice President George Bush visited Cambridge in 1981; and

WHEREAS: In October 1981, William was appointed to the Elderly Task Force, where he was a vigorous advocate for senior issues; and

WHEREAS: William retired from the Police Department on December 26, 1987; and

WHEREAS: William was an extremely generous man; he was always ready to help anyone who needed help and he gave unstintingly of himself; and

WHEREAS: William used his gifts of love and laughter freely for the benefit of his family, his friends and his community, and all were the better for his love and life; and

WHEREAS: William passed away on January 27, 1999; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the newly constructed park adjacent to Neville Place on the hilltop overlooking Fresh Pond within the Fresh Pond Reservation be dedicated as

“William G. Maher Park”
