Sundry offers have been received by the City Council for the purchase of land on Broadway and Sixth Street formerly the site of the Parker School it is

ORDERED:-

That His Honor, the Mayor, be and hereby is authorized, in the name of and in behalf of the City of Cambridge to sell and convey for a sum not less than six thousand, six hundred (6600) dollars a parcel of land situated and described as follows:-

Beginning at a point at the intersection of the Southwesterly line of Broadway and the Northwesterly line of Sixth Street, thence Southwesterly along said Northwesterly line of Sixth Street one hundred and twenty-seven (127.0) feet to a point, thence Northwesterly along the Southwesterly line of the described parcel ninety-seven (97.0) feet to a point at the intersection of the Southeasterly and the Southwesterly lines of Jordan Place thence Northeasterly along said Southeasterly line of Jordan Place one hundred and twenty-seven (127.0) feet to a point in the aforementioned Southwesterly line of Broadway, thence Southeasterly along said Southwesterly line of Broadway ninety-seven (97.0) feet to the point of beginning, containing 12,319 sq. feet. All above measurements and area are more or less.

The above-described parcel of land is shown as lot No. 10 on Assessors Block Plan Tracing No. 43, dated October 1929 and is on file in the office of the City Engineer of Cambridge, Massachusetts.

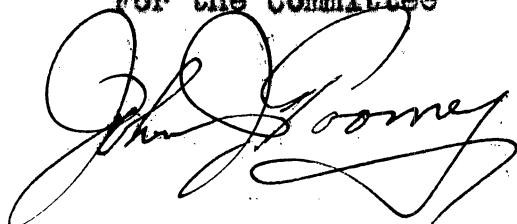
