WHEREAS: Notice has been received that an erroneous analysis and decision by the Departments of Public Works and Parks and Recreation calls for the cutting down of the chestnut tree at the corner of Rindge Avenue and Hollis Street despite an outside professional judgment which confirms that the chestnut tree is in good health. While the destruction of the tree has been postponed momentarily, it must be cancelled permanently; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager meet immediately with the Commissioner of Public Works and the Director of Parks and Recreation to remedy this error and insure that the chestnut tree at Rindge Avenue and Hollis Street is not destroyed and that a carefully policed process be in place citywide to insure that other healthy trees will not be subject to the risk of a decision to destroy which is rooted in error; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager report back to this Council on March 27, 1989 to confirm that the chestnut tree at Rindge Avenue and Hollis Street will be left alone. Additionally, that the City Manager report back to the Council by April 10, 1989 to confirm that the referenced departments have a fail-safe process which will preclude the possibility of healthy trees falling victim to destruction.

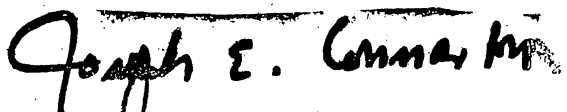
