

Color guard honored

Younger members were honored a week later at the CYO banquet, with cadets winning best rifles and best sabres and tying a Stoneham team for best flags. The cadets also received their championship medals earned a month earlier. The prep guard earned best sabres and April English was named best captain.

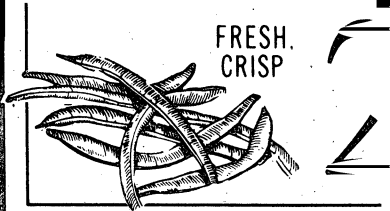
...not just every three years at contract time. We want to be in the room when those decisions are made that affect us."
