WHEREAS: In 1991, a hundred and two years later, Cambridge City Hall still serves as the center of civic involvement, and an imposing architectural presence on a small hill near the geographic center of the city; and

WHEREAS: Through the work of Harriet S. White and the staff of the Cambridge Historical Commission, the history of our City Hall is beautifully described, richly illustrated, and well documented, in a new booklet "Cambridge City Hall 1890 to 1990"; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council praises Harriet White and the Historical Commission for the research and printing of this publication about the building we all know so well and enjoy working in; be it hereby further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and is hereby requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to Harriet White on behalf of a grateful City Council.
