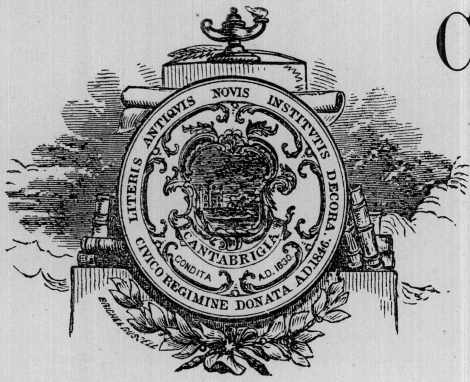




CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN,

April 30, 1873

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Elm Street
from Harvard Street to the Somerville Line

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land

Forty
feet — in width between *Harvard Street* — and
— *the Somerville line* —

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *J. G. Chase*
City Engineer, dated *August 1870*

and now before this Board, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid.

and also

Order: That Thirty days be allowed
for the removal of all fences or other
obstructions standing on the land so taken
as aforesaid.

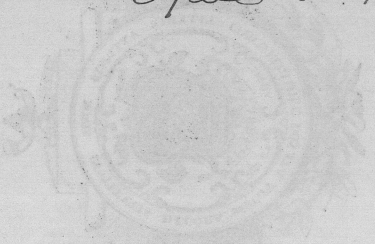
