Mr. Joseph Timothy Keohane died on May 24, 1974 while a member of the Newtowne Court Tenant Council and had served as its Vice Chairman, and

WHEREAS:

Mr. Keohane, the husband of Louise Keohane of 35 Newtowne Court, Cambridge and an employee of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, was a member of the Open Space Planning Task Force seeking improvements for the environmental quality of life within Newtowne Court, and

WHEREAS:

Both the Model Cities Board and the Newtowne Court Tenant Councils recently passed resolves requesting that the now complete Open Space Improvements in Newtowne Court be named in memory of the community advocacy efforts of Mr. Keohane, and

WHEREAS:

This City Council also wishes to record for all time the memory of this outstanding son of Cambridge who at the age of only thirty-nine was suddenly taken from his family, therefore be it

RESOLVED:

That the City Council hereby declares that the Open Space Development within Newtowne Court be named "The Joseph T. Keohane Park" in honor of his record of volunteer community service, and be it further

RESOLVED:

That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to make the necessary arrangements for the dedication of this area in memory of Mr. Keohane, which shall include but not be limited to appropriate conveyances to the Cambridge Housing Authority, the Model Cities Board and the Newtowne Court Tenant Council.
