My Dear Mr. Russell:-

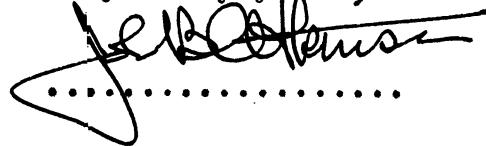
Please permit me to thank you on behalf of my Mother and myself for your thoughtfulness in forwarding the set of resolutions regarding the death of my Father, to the City Council.

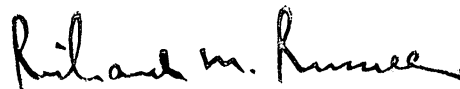
