WHEREAS: Bob was a conscientious city employee who always did his best for the city he loved; and

WHEREAS: Bob was an active parishioner of Our Lady of Pity Church where he served as vice chairman of the church council, and he was also a past president and member of the St. Vincent DePaul Society, a life member of the Knights of Columbus and a board member of the Cambridge Council, Boy Scouts of America and the U.A.V.; and

WHEREAS: Bob will be sorely missed by all his surviving family, his wife Marie; his sons Kevin and Steven; his daughters Joyce Kenney, Carol Frechette and Mary Hrul; his brother Paul; his sister Yvonne Bernard and his ten grandchildren; now therefore be it
