- WHEREAS: Bernard participated in liberating prisoners at the concentration camp at Buchenwald in Germany in 1945; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard belonged to many associations and organizations such as the Mission Hill Theatre Group, the George Wright Golf Club, the American Legion Post #327; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard was the founder of the Boston Holocaust Memorial; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his daughters Marie Power and Eileen M. Fitzgerald; his sons Bernard L., Jr.; Kevin W., Brian M., Daniel J., Shawn P. Fitzgerald and Michael G. Hammond; his sisters Rita F. Kelly, Patricia and Mary C. Fitzgerald; his brother Joseph C. Fitzgerald and fourteen grandchildren; and
- WHEREAS: Bernard will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

Bernard Fitzgerald, 76

Retired ABCC investigator

Bernard L. Fitzgerald, a retired investigator for the Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission and employee of the State Retirement Board, died Friday at his home in Dedham. He was 76.

Mr. Fitzgerald was a former resident of Mission Hill and a 1940 graduate of Mission High School. He went to Boston College on a football scholarship but interrupted his studies to join the Army at the outbreak of World War II.

As a member of the 531st combat engineers, he was involved in the D-Day invasion of Normandy. He remained in active service in Europe through the end of the war, eventually participating in the liberation of the Buchenwald concentration camp in Germany.

On his return to the United States, Mr. Fitzgerald completed his studies at Boston College, graduating with the class of 1949.

He was a member of the Mission Hill Theater Group, the George Wright Golf Club, and American Legion Post 327. He was also a founder of the Boston Holocaust Memorial.

Mr. Fitzgerald leaves two daughters, Marie (Maguire) Power of Norwood and Eileen M. of Mission Hill; seven sons, Bernard L. Jr. of West Roxbury, state Representative Kevin W. of Jamaica Plain, Brian M. of Roslindale, Daniel J. of Winchester, Shawn P. of New York, Thomas O. of Jamaica Plain, and Michael G. Hammond of South Boston; three sisters, Rita F. Kelly of Dedham, and Patricia and Mary C., both of West Roxbury; a brother, Joseph C. of Westwood; and 14 grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 11 a.m. tomorrow in Mission Church on Mission Hill. Burial will be in St. Joseph Cemetery.
