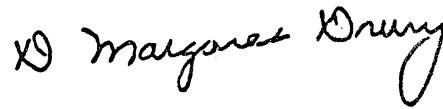

John F. Dever, at 63, chaired county commission

John F. Dever, former chairman of the Middlesex County Commission, died at his home in Woburn Saturday. He was 63.

Mr. Dever was commission chairman from 1962, the year he was elected to the commission, to 1972.

He was appointed to the Intergovernmental Relations Committee by President Johnson, and was reappointed by President Nixon.

Mr. Dever worked in the unsuccessful presidential campaign of Hubert Humphrey in 1968, and was a delegate to the Democratic Party convention in Chicago that year.

He was a candidate for lieutenant governor in 1966, and was the Democratic nominee for Middlesex County sheriff

in 1970.

He worked in the state treasurer's office under Robert Q. Crane and Joseph D. Malone, and transferred to the state auditor's office at the request of Auditor Joseph DeNucci.

Mr. Dever also was a former deputy boxing commissioner, and a past president of the County Commissioners and Sheriffs Association.

He was born in Cambridge and graduated from Villanova University.

Mr. Dever is survived by his wife, Janet; three daughters, and three sons.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. Wednesday in St. Barbara's Church. He will be buried in Woodbrook Cemetery.
