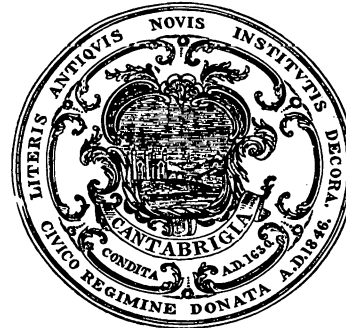

The Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Cambridge,

The undersigned, your petitioner, respectfully represents, that about seventeen years ago, Dr. Watson, Mr. Z. Whitney and himself gave the name of Watson Street, to the street in your city, which is the first street south of & running parallel with Auburn Street. Said Street extends from Pearl Street on the West to Brooklyn Street on the east. Said Street has been known by the name of Watson Street ever since, and all the deeds for Real Estate bordering on said Street are recorded as bounding on Watson Street. The undersigned, about 13 years ago, placed a sign board on the corner of Pearl and this Street with the name of Watson Street, where it has remained ever since. The undersigned is desirous that the street above referred to shall retain the name of Watson Street, as at the time it was named, there was no other of that name in your city. And your petitioner as in duty bound, will ever pray.
