Was biochemist at Woods

Neal William Cornell of mouth, a scientist at the V Hole Marine Biological Laboratory, died of cancer at home Tuesday. He was 62.

Mr. Cornell was born raised in Savannah, Ga. He lived in Falmouth since 1988.

Mr. Cornell received his doctorate's degree in biological chemistry from the University of California Los Angeles in 1963. He completed his postgraduate work at Harvard Medical School.

In 1966 he joined the faculty of Pomona College as a professor of chemistry. He also served as a visiting scientist in the laboratory of Hans Krebs in Oxford, England.

Mr. Cornell returned to United States to take a research position at the National Institute of Alcohol Abuse and Alcoholism.
