WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of **Endicott "Chub" Peabody**, a former governor of Massachusetts on December 2, 1997 at the age of 71 after a year-long battle with leukemia; and

WHEREAS: Endicott Peabody was born in Lawrence, attended the William Penn Charter School in Philadelphia, graduated from Groton in 1938, and went on to Harvard College, where he was a varsity football star named All-American left guard in 1941; and

WHEREAS: After graduating from college, Endicott served his country in the Navy during World War II; he volunteered for submarine service and was awarded the Silver Star for Gallantry in Action; and

WHEREAS: After the war, Endicott graduated from Harvard Law School and joined the firm of Goodwin, Procter & Hoar; and

WHEREAS: Endicott Peabody began his political career as a governor's councillor in 1955 and 1956, representing a district including the City of Cambridge, where he resided; and

WHEREAS: Endicott served as Governor of Massachusetts for a two-year term in 1963 and 1964; and

WHEREAS: Thereafter, he had two more successful careers, one as a Washington lawyer-lobbyist, and finally, as he put it, as "a country lawyer" in New Hampshire, where he moved in 1983; and

WHEREAS: Endicott's passing will leave a void in the lives of all of his surviving friends and family, his wife Barbara W. "Toni" Gibbons; his sons Endicott, Jr. and Robert L.; his daughter Barbara Cusick; his brothers Samuel, George and Malcolm, Jr. and his six grandchildren; and

WHEREAS: Endicott will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to the family of **Endicott Peabody** at this time of such personal loss; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to the Peabody family on behalf of the entire City Council.
