Martin F. Nolan first entered the service of the City of Cambridge on July 5, 1939 in the Auditing Department and served at the Cambridge City Hospital in the Accounting Department from September 1, 1940 until his appointment as City Auditor on June 2, 1951 upon the retirement of the late John J. McKenzie, and

WHEREAS:-

Martin F. Nolan served the City of Cambridge as Comptroller of Accounts and Director of the Division of Finance and was recognized throughout the Commonwealth as an authority on Municipal financial matters and was of great assistance to this City Council in solving the financial problems of the City of Cambridge, and

We admired him for his sound judgment and clarity of expression, and loved him for his fairness and generosity, and esteemed him for his great courage and his constant devotion to the interests of the City of Cambridge, and

Martin F. Nolan was not only an outstanding public official but was also a devoted son of Boston College, a member of the Golden Anniversary Class of 1918 and an active participant in every fund drive inaugurated by the College, therefore be it
