WHEREAS:

The attention of the City Council has been called to the death of John T. Phelan a former member of the Common Council, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of this sad event.

Mr. Phelan was a member of the Common Council in 1889. From that year on, while he continued his interest in public affairs, ~~his~~ his rapidly growing business precluded his holding public office and he retired to private life. He never lost his interest, however, and, until the time of his death, was an active public spirited citizen always eager to support any movement looking to the advancement of Cambridge generally and in particular to the Harvard Square district. where he spent the greater part of his life. For years he was a member of the Harvard Square Business Men's Association and many social and fraternal organizations.

That, in the death of John T. Phelan, the City of Cambridge has suffered the loss of an honest, upstanding, public spirited citizen and hereby records this fact upon its records.
