In Common Council Nov. 28th 1866

The Committee on Ordinances have taken into consideration the subject of "Burial Fees to be charged by Undertakers, and an Ordinance concerning the same", and submit the following report - viz: - They find that under the Ordinance already existing, fees of Undertakers are judiciously limited to fair prices; but this ordinance was drawn when all Hearses were furnished by the City - at the present time there is but one City Hearse, which is old, unfashioned, and out of repair, so that in nearly all interments the undertaker is required to furnish a private Hearse, for which he is not limited in price by Ordinance, and can charge what he pleases - They also find that some limit should be put to charges of Undertakers for taking a body beyond the City limits; -

Therefore to correct these deficiencies, and in obedience to the order of the City Council, they beg leave to present the accompanying Ordinance for the Committee
