Eillene Roosevelt, 81

Was Cataumet homemaker

Eillene "Terry" Roosevelt of Cataumet, a homemaker, died of respiratory failure Friday in Falmouth Hospital. She was 81.

Mrs. Roosevelt was born in North Cambridge, where her father, Timothy J. Horan, was once president of the Cambridge City Council.

As a young woman, she participated in community theater activities in Cambridge and later, while living on Long Island, N.Y., she organized bus tours to shows in New York City. She enjoyed dancing and often served as a crew member on her husband's sailboat on Long Island Sound and on summer cruises and races from New York to New England.

She was a volunteer at a Long Island hospital that cared for underprivileged children. In 1978, upon retirement, she and her husband moved to Cataumet on Cape Cod.

She leaves her husband, James West Roosevelt; a sister, Elizabeth Newell of Melbourne Beach, Fla.; and four brothers, John Horan of Vancouver, British Columbia, Timothy Horan of New York City, Robert Horan of Superior, Colo., and Richard Horan of Groton, Conn.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. Thursday in St. John the Evangelist Church in Pocasset. Burial will be private.
