On behalf of the Cambridge Rotary Club and the Chamber of Commerce, I would like to extend a personal invitation to you to attend the Cambridge Careers Convocation, October 21-22, at the Cambridge War Memorial Auditorium.

The Convocation, jointly sponsored by the Rotary and Chamber, will provide an opportunity for all Cambridge high school students to learn more about the occupational careers open to them in Cambridge and the Greater Boston area. More than 200 specific occupations, ranging from teacher to carpenter to meteorologist, will be presented in 70 Convocation booths. Answers to students' questions relating to educational and skill requirements for specific careers will be provided by over 300 representatives from industry, government and institutions.

Students from Cambridge High and Latin and Rindge Technical Schools are scheduled to attend the Convocation on Thursday and Friday, while non-public and parochial school students will come on Friday afternoon. We have set aside Friday, from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., for the general public.

We view the Convocation as a first step toward greater cooperation between Cambridge industry, institutions and the community. We hope you can make it.
