- WHEREAS: Several transportation companies have recently applied to the Cambridge City Council to conduct tourist activities in Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS: The City Council in response has aksed the City Manager to appoint a representative committee to develop policies for the city within this area; and
- WHEREAS: Apparently state law permits the Department of Public Utilities to issue licenses for such purposes if a city council has not acted within 60 days, thus effectively bypassing the city council in this important matter; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council declare a moratorium in the issuance of new licenses for tourism until it receives the report of the committee it has asked to study this matter, together with the recommendation of the City Manager; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That all pending applications be denied until the new policy is issued; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to inform the Department of Public Utilities of this action without delay and to gain their cooperation in refraining from issuing any such licenses until Cambridge has considered and adopted new policies.
