To the Honorable the
Board of Mayor and Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge

The First Universalist Society
of said Cambridge, acting by its Standing
Committee, respectfully represents that
by the contemplated action of your
Honorable Board in widening Front St.
in said Cambridge it will suffer very
great damage in its property; that
after the proposed taking but a small
lot of land will be left which will be
utterly inadequate to its needs; that a
new location must be sought, a
new Church edifice erected thereon
whereby said Society will incur great
expense and its members be put to
great trouble and largely increased
outlay in providing a suitable
place of worship;

While recognizing the principle that
private interests must yield to those
of the public, said Society feels con-

strained to enter its objection for the
reasons above stated to the proposed
action of your Honorable Board in
the premises and requests that its
objections be duly entered and considered
in further proceedings.
