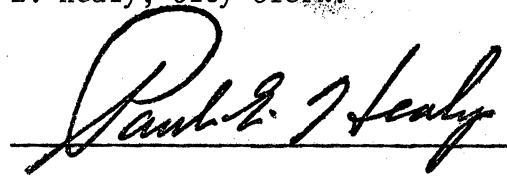

IN CITY COUNCIL
October 28, 1985

WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Ethel C. Cash at the age of 70; and

WHEREAS: After growing up in Dallas, Texas, Ethel matriculated at Sam Houston College (now Houston-Tillison College) where she received her B.A. in English and went on to complete her graduate work at Oberlin University; and

WHEREAS: On August 17, 1940, Ethel married Bernard Clifford Cash and they were blessed with two daughters, Ethlyn and Brenda, and moved to Cambridge where Ethel has remained a resident for over forty years; and

WHEREAS: For twenty-eight years Ethel was a dedicated employee of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles, and following her retirement ten years ago, she remained a vigorous participant in such activities as her sorority, Alpha Kappa Alpha, and the Cambridge Foster Grandparents Program; and

WHEREAS: For over thirty years, she was a tireless and beloved member of St. Paul AME Church. Ethel served in many capacities including member and past president of Stewardess Board No. 3, teacher and former superintendent of the Sunday School, and member of the Margaret Hazel Missionary Society. As a foster grandparent she worked in the Henry Buckner School for five years and played a vital role in sharing her love and shaping the lives of countless young children; and

WHEREAS: Ethel leaves to mourn her two daughters, Ethlyn B. Cash and Brenda C. Cooper; one sister, Ruby Lightfoot; one granddaughter, Stephanie Ann Cash; one great grandson, Kenneth Cash; two nephews; two nieces; a father-in-law, Byrd C. Cash; a longstanding friend, Henry Turner; and a host of relatives, friends, co-workers, fellow-saints, and schoolchildren, all who will miss her very much; therefore, be it
