The City Council has received from His Honor the Mayor official notification of the death of John B. Dore, an honored citizen and a member of the Board of Park Commissioners, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of this sad event.

Mr. Dore was born in Boston in 1868 and resided in Cambridge for about twenty-five years. His early education was acquired at Boston College and Holy Cross College. He later entered Boston University, studied law, received his degree and has been a practicing attorney ever since. His activities were many and varied - in law, in finance, in fraternal associations and as a member of the Board of Park Commissioners of the City of Cambridge. He was appointed a member of the said Commission in 1920 and served with credit to himself and to the city until his death. Strong in his impressions, yet always a desire for the right, was the basis of the character of John B. Dore and, in the many organizations of which he was a member, his presence will be sadly missed.

It is therefore

RESOLVED:

That, to his bereaved widow and other members of his family, we extend our deep sympathy in their great loss. We desire to bear testimony to the value of his personal character and the good influence which he exercised, not only as a public official but as a private citizen, during the years he resided in our city. May his life among us be held in kind remembrance.
