To The Honorable The City Council,

On April 15, 1981 the Bicycle Coalition petitioned the Cambridge City Council for permission to close a section of Amherst Street for the purpose of holding a bicycle fair and to allow the sale of a limited amount of low cost bicycle safety equipment. We have been coordinating this event with M.I.T., unfortunately through a misunderstanding on our part the petition to close that section of Amherst Street did not sufficiently address the concerns of M.I.T. We therefore request that you rescind the Council Order of April 27th allowing the Bicycle Coalition to close Amherst Street on June 14, 1981. We further request permission to conduct the sale of a limited amount of bicycle safety equipment and T-shirts on a portion of the parking spaces on the north side of Amherst Street on Sunday June 14, 1981.

It is the intent of the Bicycle Coalition to continue to work closely with M.I.T. and the Cambridge Traffic & Parking Dept. to insure that the use of the above mentioned parking spaces is done in a manner agreeable to all parties concerned.
