WHEREAS: For the last 18 years, the Cambridge Council for Children has helped create a responsive service system for children and their families in our city; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Council for Children has contributed to the development of ShortStop, an emergency shelter for youth; the Castle School for disturbed adolescents; Temporary Care Services, a respite care program for families with developmentally disabled children; the Teen Health Clinic at CRLS; and the Adolescent Parenting Program at CRLS; and

WHEREAS: The Council has made a concerted effort to inform parents and professionals about a range of issues that affect children and families; and

WHEREAS: The state's elimination of an Office for Children staff person has moved the Cambridge Council to disband since it can no longer effectively function; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council recognizes and commends the Cambridge Council for Children and the Office for Children staff members, Hap Tierney and Ginny Lindsay, for their immense contribution to the well-being of Cambridge children and families; and further be it

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare suitably engrossed copies of this resolution for presentation to Cambridge Council for Children members and Office for Children staff.
