Music teacher

Bernice Cain Patterson died on June 5 at Goddard House in Boston. She was 86.

Born in Augusta, Ill., she was a resident of Cambridge for over 40 years. A high school music teacher, she lived and taught in the Chicago area until moving to Cambridge, where her husband, Bryan, accepted an appointment at Harvard University as the Agassiz

Professor of Paleontology.

In Cambridge, she dedicated herself to a variety of community activities. She served on the board of the Cambridge League of Women Voters for many years, including its presidency, and the board of the Cambridge YWCA. She continued her association with the Midwest-based service organization, the PEO, and was instrumental in aiding its rejuvenation in the Boston area. For many years, she was the chair of the lecture series for Harvard Neighbors. Continuing her interest in government, she regularly served as campaign treasurer for several school committee and city council members.

She is survived by a son, Alan, of Somerville.

A remembrance will be held on June 26 at 3:30 pm at Harvard Neighbors, 17 Quincy St., Cambridge.
