Antonio Fernandes, 76

Owned Cambridge grocery store

Antonio Fernandes, proprietor of the Elm Provision Co. grocery store in East Cambridge from 1945 to 1969, died Wednesday at Cambridge Hospital. He was 76 and a lifelong resident of Cambridge.

From 1970 to 1980, Mr. Fernandes held a sales position with Central Bakery in East Cambridge.

During World War II, he served as a corporal in the Army artillery in North Africa and in Italy, where he was wounded.

He leaves his wife, Mary (Souza); three sons, Paul of Brockton, Robert of Hendersonville, Tenn., and George of Cambridge; three sisters, Mary Morris of St. Petersburg, Fla., Agnes Padon of Lady Lake, Fla., and Theresa Young of Randolph; a brother, John of Cambridge; seven granddaughters; and four great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 11 a.m. tomorrow in St. Anthony's Church, Cambridge. Burial will be in Cambridge Cemetery.
