We as an inner city company respectfully request that your recent authorization for the two hour parking signs just installed on Broadway between Prospect and Norfolk Street be removed.

Electro Powerpacs Corp. is located at 253 Norfolk Street. We employ seventy people most from the Cambridge area. We agreed to revitalize this inner city company in 1970 when Tip O'Neill's office assisted us in getting a small business loan so the company could continue. The writer came in as President, and we have prospered since that time. I believe we are making a great contribution to the area with a payroll of over \$1,250,000 plus.

If the parking places are limited during the day to two hours we will lose what little space we can use for about six of our employees who have to drive. They park only from eight to four thirty. We need your help if Cambridge wants to keep small inner city companies going which hire semi-skilled and unskilled labor.

We would be delighted to appear before you if necessary. Thank you for your consideration.
