A memorial service will be held Sunday at 5 p.m. in St. Timothy's Church in Norwood for Tony Frasca, a former hockey star and all-scholastic in baseball and football at Cambridge Latin High School in the 1940s.

Mr. Frasca died April 1 in Colorado Springs. He was 71.

After graduating from Cambridge Latin in 1945, he went to Colorado and played hockey at Colorado College, where he was an All-American and became a coach and professor.

He was a member of the school's 1950 national championship team. In 1963, his last year of coaching there, he was named Coach Of The Year by the US Hockey Coaches Association.

From 1958 to 1990, he was an assistant professor at the school in physical education, coached the baseball team for 24 years, and was director of intramural sports and of the ice rink.
