Reverend John J. Murphy had attained many honors in his service with the United States Army which comprised service in Korea, Germany, France, Vietnam and Japan and was awarded the Legion of Merit, the Bronze Star, the Meritorious Service Medal and the Vietnamese Medal of Gallantry and was promoted to the rank of Colonel prior to his selection as Commandant of the United States Army Chaplain Center at Fort Wadsworth, New York in 1975, and

WHEREAS:

Reverend John J. Murphy from the time of his ordination in 1944 until his passing was a dedicated priest who furthered his studies in both the religious and the military at Fordham University Institute of Russian Studies, Catholic University and the Graduate Theological Union and Pacific School of Religion at Berkeley after he entered active duty as a Chaplain in 1949, and
