WHEREAS: The North Cambridge Railroad Safety Committee was formed as a result of several previous deaths that occurred on said tracks; and

WHEREAS: Funds have been allocated to begin the design phase of pedestrian crossings over said tracks; and

WHEREAS: The MBTA has consistently refused to follow through on short term safety measures; now therefore be it

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to confer with the Community Development Department to make sure that the City is proceeding quickly to design the entire pedestrian overpass project; and be it further

ORDERED: That the MBTA be encouraged to install the appropriate safety signage at the tracks and that all current at grade pedestrian crossing signals are operational; and be it further

ORDERED: That if the MBTA continues to refuse to install such signage, that the City do so; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager confer with the MBTA regarding the extension of bus service from Rindge Avenue to the Fresh Pond Mall and if it refuses, to ascertain whether the City can offer such services; and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager insure that pedestrian ways over the Alewife Bridge are cleared of snow and ice in a timely manner following a storm.

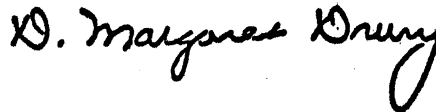

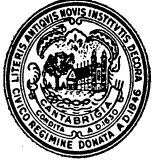
