The names of the Co-Chairmen and Treasurer are:

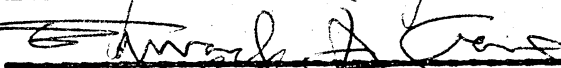

" Shall the elective officers of this city be nominated by preliminary election and elected by ordinary plurality voting ? "

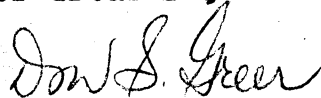
