Gentlemen,

At a meeting of the
"Committee" appointed by the citizens of Cambridge, Jan^y 20th inst.
held last evening. It was unanimously Voted - That we
recommend the construction of the new bridge, on the line
of "West Chester-Bank" extension, and that the approaches to
the northerly end of the bridge be

1st - via - The Mount Street extension.

2^d - " - Port Washington by a bridge over the Grand Junction Railroad.

3^d - " - The Sixth Street extension.

That estimates be made immediately, to ascertain the cost
of these approaches, and negotiations be made with the
"Charles River Embankment Co." to seek their cooperation in
securing two of these approaches at once.

Voted - That the Chairman submit a report of this action
of the Committee, to the City Council forthwith.
