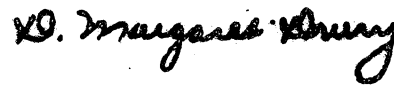

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened at learning of the death of Royal L. Bolling Sr. on July 16, 2002; and
- WHEREAS: Royal was a United States Army World War II veteran where he was awarded the Silver Star, the Purple Heart, four Battle Stars and the Combat Infantryman Badge for extraordinary leadership and valor under fire; and
- WHEREAS: After the war, Royal attended Harvard University and later launched Eureka Real Estate, a company he owned for fifty years; and
- WHEREAS: Royal was elected to the House of Representatives in 1961 where he spent twelve years; and
- WHEREAS: Royal was later elected to the state Senate in 1982, a position he held for eight years and where his authorship of the Racial Imbalance Law led to the desegregation of Boston Public Schools; and
- WHEREAS: Royal was the devoted husband of the late Thelma (Greene) Bolling; and
- WHEREAS: Royal was the father of the late Diane Bolling; and
- WHEREAS: Royal's passing will leave a void in the lives of all his surviving family, his children former State Representative Royal L. Bolling Jr., Blair, Thelma (AwRa), Richard (Yom), Carolyn, Deborah, Charlene, Andrea (Ra'nna) and Lorraine; his brothers Donald and Orrie Tucker; his several grandchildren; his great-grandchildren; and his nieces and nephews; and
- WHEREAS: Royal will be sorely missed by all he touched and loved; now therefore be it
