- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our deepest appreciation and gratitude to Manuel Brown, Ester Bryant, Paul Metivier, Angelina Silva, Antonio Simoes and Ruth White for their untiring efforts on behalf of the many patients, faculty and staff of the Cambridge Hospital; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitable resolution on behalf of the City Council for presentation to these dedicated volunteers to record the sentiment of this City Council.
