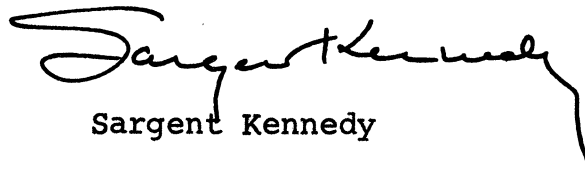
Gentlemen:

The President and Fellows at its meeting on May 5 considered the resolution of the Cambridge City Council of April 28, 1969. The Corporation is referring it to the Long Range Study Committee of the Board of Overseers appointed to consider the governance of the University.

As you know, the University has two officials responsible to the President and Fellows, Mr. Charles P. Whitlock, whose duty is to work constantly on Governmental Relations, and Mr. Edward S. Gruson, to work exclusively on Community Affairs. The interest of both these officials is, of course, to do everything possible to promote the closest communications between the University and the City government and the neighborhoods of Cambridge and Boston. Many constructive developments along this line have led the Corporation to feel that they can count on a future of benefit to all of us.
