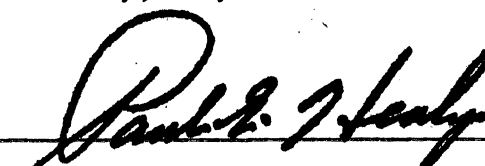
COUNCILLOR WALTER SULLIVAN

- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Thomas C. McCarthy, a native Cantabrigian and Press Box Steward at both Fenway Park and Boston Garden; and
- WHEREAS: Tommy, who grew up in Cambridge supporting his widowed mother, got his first introduction to sports in the early 1930's when he worked for the Postal Telegraph Company and one of his duties was to run copy from the Boston Garden to the telegraphers, and later went to work at both the Boston Garden for Walter Brown and for the late Red Sox owner Tom Yawkey, jobs he held for fifty-two years; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout the years Tommy had served the Bruins, Red Sox, Braves, Celtics and the Patriots as Press Box Steward, and it is unanimously agreed by the Boston sportswriters that the press boxes will never be the same, since nobody could replace a fellow who enjoyed going out of his way to help someone else without seeking personal gratification; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Helen (Cashman) McCarthy at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. McCarthy on behalf of the entire City Council.
