WHEREAS: Silvio attended Rindge Technical High School, graduating in 1954 and entered the service where he served in the Army from 1955 to 1957 in the 82nd Airborne; and

WHEREAS: Silvio married Dina Alosa from East Boston on March 25, 1961, and they were blessed when their son Silvio J. Scaglione Jr. was born on February 27, 1962 and their daughter Donna was born on January 10, 1964; and again in 1967 when their daughter Nancy was born; and

WHEREAS: Silvio received his BS from Boston University in 1963 and his Masters in Education from Boston State College in 1965; and

WHEREAS: Silvio began his career teaching sixth grade at the Center School in Newton in September of 1962; he proceeded to teach in schools in Lexington, Whitman, Chelmsford and Woburn; and

WHEREAS: Silvio returned to Cambridge in September, 1971 where he taught fourth grade at the Agassiz School and subsequently taught at the Peabody, Lincoln and Kennedy Schools; and

WHEREAS: Silvio also served as a Summer School Director, a Master's Assistant, an Acting Submaster; coached North Cambridge Little League, was a member of the National Education Association, Massachusetts Teachers Association and the Cambridge Teachers Association; and

WHEREAS: Silvio served as the Treasurer of the North Cambridge Planning Team and was a founding member of the Sunlight and a member of the French Club where he is the only Italian from North Cambridge who is a member; now therefore be it

Whereas Silvio Attended Rindge Technical High School, Cambridge, graduating in 1954 and entered the service where he served in the Army from 1955 to 1957 in the 82nd Airborne, and

Whereas Silvio Married Dina Aloia from East Boston on March 25, 1961 and were blessed when their son

His son, Silvio J. Scaglione Jr., was born nearly a year later on Feb. 27th, 1962. And his three daughters

Received his BS from Boston University in 1963, and

His first daughter, Donna, was born the following year on Jan. 10th, 1964, and in 1967 his daughter Nancy was born, and.

Received his Masters in Education from Boston State College in 1965.

Began his career in September, 1962, teaching 6th grade at the Center School in Newton. From there he taught in schools in Lexington, Whitman, Chelmsford and Woburn. In Woburn, he also served as Summer School Director in 1967, the year his youngest -- Nancy -- was born and the Red Sox broke his and everyone else's heart -- again.

Came back to the People's Republic of Cambridge -- his beloved hometown -- in September, 1971, teaching 4th grade at the Agassiz School. He stayed in Cambridge for 27 years teaching at the Peabody, Lincoln and Kennedy schools.

His career also included work at the Agassiz, where he was a Master's Assistant for six years, and the Longfellow, where he was Acting Submaster for six months.

Longtime member of the National Education Association, Massachusetts Teachers Association and Cambridge Teachers Association, for which he was Treasurer and also a member of the Negotiating Team for many years.

He coached North Cambridge Little League for six years.

He showed great Italian-North Cantabrigian diplomacy as Treasurer of the North Cambridge Planning Team. He made sure the neighborhood fared well during the Red Line extension project of the late '70's, got himself on the 11 O'Clock News, but didn't quite endear himself to some important politicians.

Despite all the school and community work, Silvio always found time to play at the Sunlight, of which he is a founding member. And he is the only Italian from North Cambridge who is a member of the always-welcoming French Club.

Whereas: Silvio began his career Teaching Sixth grade at the Center School in Newton in Sept of 1962; he proceeded to teach in schools in Lexington, Whitman, Chelmsford and Woburn; and

Whereas Silvio returned to Cambridge in September, 1971 where he taught 4th grade at the Agassiz School and subsequently taught at the Peabody, Lincoln and Kennedy Schools; and

Whereas: Silvio also served as a Summer School Director, a Master's Assistant, a Acting Submaster; Coached NC Little League, was a member of the Nat'l Education Association, Mass. Teachers Assoc and the Camb Teachers Assoc; and

Whereas Silvio served as the Treasurer of the NC Planning Team and was a founding member of the Sunlight and a member of the Gaelic Club where he is the only Italian from NC who is a member; and

Silvio is a survivor of many things, including two bouts with serious skin cancer, one bus whacking outside the Sunlight that sent him to Mount Auburn, two heart attacks, bypass surgery, and many rowdy MTA and NEA Conventions.

Silvio never forgot his friends, especially me, whom he would always call on St. Patrick's Day, and I, in turn, would call Silvio on St. Joseph's Day.

Today, Silvio no longer runs the jogging route around Fresh Pond, but treks the Revere Beach boardwalk, his new stomping grounds since moving to that city in 1993. He can still be heard reminiscing about his Cambridge students of yesterday, and talking up his students of today from the Urban College of Boston, where he teaches night school.
