To The Honorable, The City Council:

I am hereby requesting the appropriation of a grant from the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority (MWRA) for \$1,506,000.00 to the Public Investment Fund Public Works Extraordinary Expenditures Account to provide funds for sewer separation in the North Cambridge and Fresh Pond areas not covered by the present Phase VI Program funded through the Massachusetts Water Pollution Abatement Trust. This is the first phase of a multi-year project completely financed by the MWRA. This phase will focus on the planning and design of the project and is expected to be completed by the spring of 1998. Prior to the beginning of construction in the summer of 1998, a request for an additional appropriation will be submitted to the City Council. It is expected that construction will be completed by the fall of 2000 with floatable controls in place by 2001.

Sewer separation in these areas will improve the environment by minimizing the Combined Sewer Overflows (CSOs) to the receiving bodies of water and will also improve stormwater flows to these areas.
