COUNCILLOR WALSH

ORDERED: Relative to every City of Cambridge employee/administrator earning an annual salary of \$50,000 or more and receiving a clothing and/or cleaning allowance and is not part of a union contract, that said cleaning and clothing allowance be terminated effective July 1, 1992; and be it further

ORDERED: That effective July 1, 1992, and on an annual basis every year thereafter, the amount of money which would have been appropriated for clothing and/or cleaning be appropriated to a Cambridge charity or to low income residents. Further, that the first donation of this money be given to the Children's Clothing Exchange, 56 Magazine Street, Cambridge (specifics of the Exchange's work are outlined on attached summary); and be it further

ORDERED: That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to report back to this Council by June 15, 1992 to confirm execution and implementation of this order.

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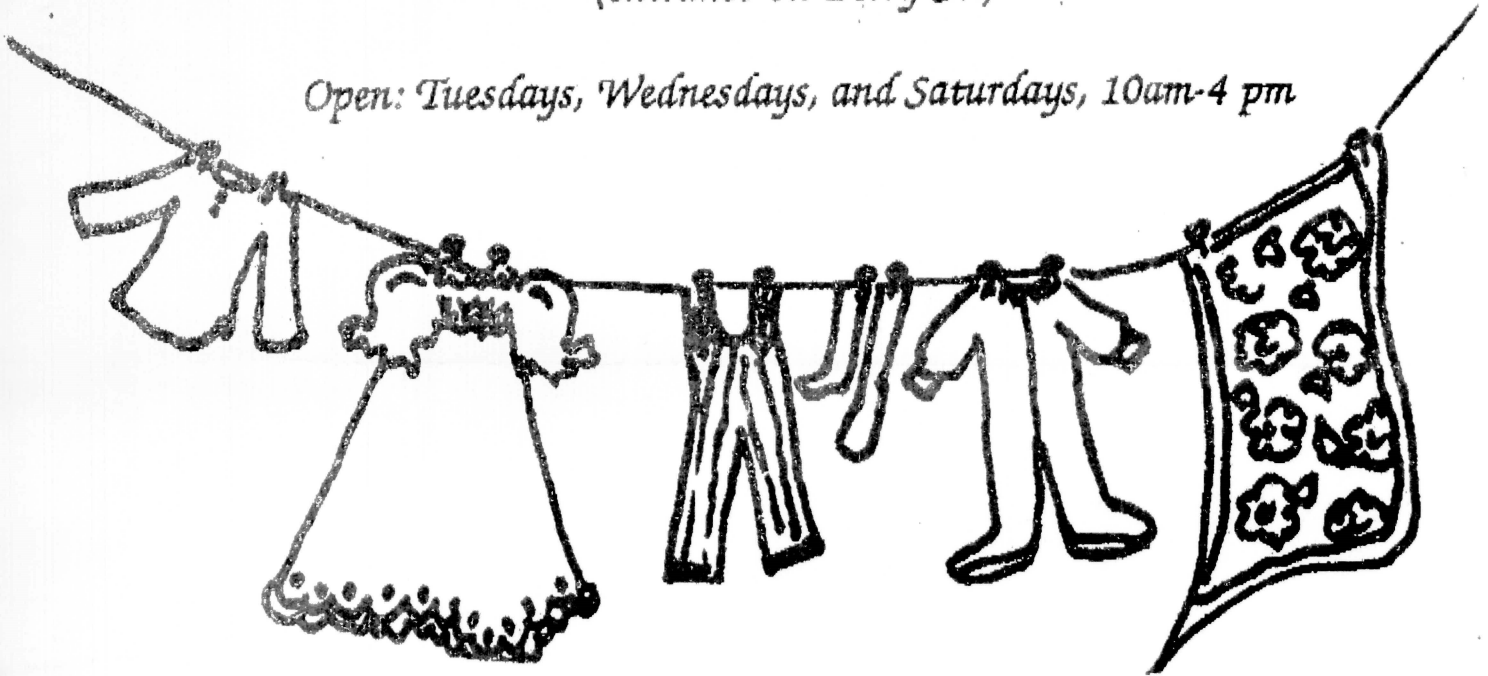
