Ordered,

That the Appropriation of Seventeen Hundred Dollars for Watering Streets be divided as follows, viz. - Police District - No. One, Five Hundred & seventy-five Dollars; Police District - No. Two, Seven Hundred Dollars; Police District - No. Three, Four Hundred & twenty-five Dollars; and that, whenever a sum not less than fifty dollars is contributed for that purpose, the Mayor, upon receiving satisfactory evidence of the same, is authorized to draw his warrant for a like sum, to be paid from the above Appropriation: - Provided, that not more than One Hundred Dollars shall be paid from the Treasury on any one street before the first day of July: - and the amount unexpended after that date shall be divided among applicants in proportion to the sums raised by them: Provided, however, that not more than one half the expense for watering any one street shall be paid from the City Treasury. - The whole of said watering and of the expenditure therefor to be under the direction of the Committee on Watering Streets!
