WHEREAS: The Cambridge Food Pantry Network/CEOC, which currently feeds more than one hundred thousand families each month, has announced their annual "Bread and Justice" food drive will take place November 5 - 28 to feed the growing number of hungry residents in Cambridge; and

WHEREAS: The Cambridge Food Pantry Network/CEOC, in cooperation with Continental Cablevision and Cambridge Municipal Cable, will be holding a HUNGER HURTS telethon on Wednesday, November 20 from 7:30-9:30 p.m. on Channels 3 and 37 to raise badly needed funds to feed the hungry; and

WHEREAS: More than two thousand pregnant women, mothers, babies, and young children must be kept on waiting lists for food programs and more than 3,000 children in Cambridge are at risk of going hungry; and

WHEREAS: Cambridge Schools will be holding a special school food drive from November 18-22; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this City Council hereby urges all city employees to participate in the Mayor's Food Drive, contributing nutritious canned and packaged food for the hungry; and be it further

RESOLVED: That this City Council urges the full support of all Cambridge residents to support the food drive and the telethon on November 20 to ensure the success of the effort to feed the hungry; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to the Cambridge Food Pantry Network and the Cambridge Economic Opportunity Committee (CEOC).
