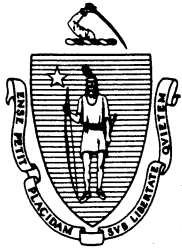

Upon the foregoing investigation, the Department of Public Utilities will conduct a public hearing in its hearing room, #1210, Leverett Saltonstall Building, 100 Cambridge Street, Boston, Massachusetts on Monday, September 24, 1984 at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon.

Petitions to intervene in these proceedings may be filed with the Department on or before the close of business on August 24, 1984. Persons desiring intervention should take notice that the Department, on August 7, 1984, issued an order in said proceedings, establishing the following procedural schedule, with which the petitioners and all intervenors are required to comply:

August 17, 1984 - Submission of direct testimony, plus all associated workpapers and documentation, by the Companies' witnesses.

August 29, 1984 - Submission of information requests by intervenors.

September 14, 1984 - Replies due to all information requests.

September 24, 1984 - Hearings begin and continue daily until cross-examination of the Companies' witness concludes.

Ten days after the close of cross-examination - Intervenors' direct testimony is due.

Proposed regulations concerning protection from termination of gas, electric and water service for those residential accounts experiencing a financial hardship and where a member of the household is seriously ill; or is an infant twelve months old or under; or where it is a heat-related account and it is between November 15 and March 15.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

On August 6, 1984 the Department voted to propose regulations concerning protections against termination of gas, electric and water service for residential accounts experiencing financial hardship.

Therefore, pursuant to G.L. c. 164, § 124, and in accordance with G.L. c. 30A, § 2, the Department has proposed regulations which supercede the existing regulations in 220 C.M.R. 25.03. These regulations are designed to implement changes in G.L. c. 164, §124, effective December 21, 1983. They are designed to protect those in financial hardship situations who also have serious illness in the household; have infants; or who have heat-related accounts when it is between November 15 and March 15.

Presentation of views, testimony, or written statements relating to these proposed regulations may be submitted by any interested party at a public hearing to be held by the Department at its hearing room #1210 on Tuesday, September 4, 1984 at ten o'clock in the forenoon.
